



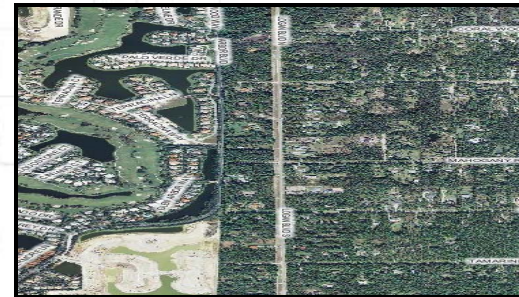
## Extension and Widening of Logan Boulevard

Naples (Collier County), Florida

October 2, 2007 marked the opening of the two mile stretch of Logan Boulevard between Vanderbilt Beach Road and Immokalee Road. GL Homes funded the \$8.5 million construction cost of this project as part of a Developer Contribution Agreement (DCA) with Collier County. Hole Montes provided design engineering, surveying, permitting, contract administration and inspection services for the roadway extension project.



Collier County transportation officials estimate that initially, approximately 9,800 motorists per day will use the Logan Boulevard extension, thus alleviating traffic on Oakes Boulevard, as well as providing a second access for the residents of Saturnia Lakes. The two mile extension is part of a larger project that will eventually extend the Santa Barbara Boulevard/Logan Boulevard corridor from Rattlesnake-Hammock Road in Collier County to Bonita Beach Road in Lee County.



Logan Boulevard was designed as a two-lane road expandable to four-lanes. The southern 1.5 miles of the project's right of way was already dedicated by the adjacent developments of Islandwalk and Saturnia Lakes.



In addition, the drainage for this segment was already designed to be accepted by the water management systems of these adjacent developments. The northern half mile of the project required the construction of a water management pond and acquisition of right of way. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (COE) claimed the project area to be in the panther habitat consultation area. Hole Montes worked with COE to establish amounts for the panther mitigation.
